Over 1,000 collectors explored the expanded bourse over the three day span, sorting through the inventories of the local, regional and national dealers. ANA Governor Walt Ostromecki was again in attendance, running close to 100 kids through the YN treasure hunt. The Numismatic Theater featured four speakers – we thank them for taking the time to provide interesting and informative talks. Eric Holcomb presented “Numismatic Washingtonia (Items depicting George Washington);” Dave Schmidt talked about “So-Called Dollars;” Anthony Kim spoke on “National Commemorative Medals Issued between 1940 and 1982;” and Buell Ish presided over the Colonial Coin Collector’s Club meeting. The exhibit area moved across the hall this year and featured some very interesting exhibits (Thank you, Del!!). Special thanks go out to the King County Coin Club for all of their hard work as host club for the event, Mike Pepka and the Boeing Employees Coin Club for their work on getting all of the material put together for the Youth Treasure Hunt, and all of the volunteers that gave their time and effort to help make the event a success. ## Call for Puyallup Fair Volunteers

Greg Smith of the Boeing Employees Coin Club is the new Puyallup Fair Hobby Hall volunteer coordinator. Volunteers are needed to work 68 three-hour shifts (4 per day for 17 days, September 5-21) at the Hobby Hall coin collecting table, greeting the public and presenting a positive image of our hobby. Extensive numismatic knowledge is not required – we have handouts with a phone number and e-mail that people can use to get more information. We also usually have foreign coins for kids!

## National Coin Week Contest Winner

The annual NCW contest sponsored by PNNA has passed the deadline for entries. Again this year there was only one entry. Olympia Coin Club of Olympia, WA is this year's winner. The judge has determined that OCC is worthy of first place based on the display and the exposure to the public. The club followed the ANA theme of "Money Makes the World Go Round" with samples of money from around the world. They gave examples of how money developed from the barter system, how it provides the world with its needs, and displayed ancient and modern money (both coins and currency) from nations of the world. The display was done in an organized and easy to follow format. The OCC display was set up in the Tumwater branch of the Timberland Regional Library where it was viewed by hundreds of people. Congratulations to the Olympia Coin Club on another great display. OCC will deposit \$100.00 into their club account.

What about the other coin clubs in the PNNA regional area? Why haven't any of you entered the NCW contest? We numismatists are always talking about spreading the word about our hobby. The NCW contest is a good way to spread the word, and possibly make some money for your club treasury. This is the reason PNNA has made this contest a permanent annual event. ## PNNA Board Meeting Minutes

5 April 2008, Tukwila, Washington

The board meeting was called to order by President Larry Gaye at 8:13 AM. Other members and directors present: Dick Billings, Danny Bisgaard, Gawain O'Connor, Steve Cox, Del Cushing, Mark Gruner, Eric Holcomb, Mike Labosier, Scott and Lisa Loos, Norm Mikat, Walt Ostromecki, Mike Sanders and Bruce Wonder.

The election results were announced. The following persons were elected to the PNNA board of directors: Lisa Loos (President), Danny Bisgaard (VP), Mike Labosier (Secretary), Scott Loos (Treasurer), Craig Korstad, Dave Ownbey, Eric Holcomb, Steve Cox, Del Cushing, Bruce Wonder, Mike Sanders, Bill McKivor, Gawain O'Connor, Robb Anglemier. Mark Gruner will likely be appointed as dealer director, and Larry Gaye remains on the board as past president.

Current President Larry Gaye reported that the numismatic hobby in the Northwest is "healthier than 20 years ago." Thanks and congratulations to everyone.

### Old and New Business

Storage Locker – Del requested that we purchase two storage racks at a cost of \$150 each for the PNNA storage locker. Motion [Del C./Norm M.] – passed. The rent for the storage facility itself is about \$435 per quarter.

Motion to accept secretary's report (including April 2007 minutes) as published. Passed.

Convention – The convention is here! Scott reported that attendance is good, etc. There was a lengthy discussion about "Early Bird" badge holders, as well as abuse of dealer badges. (Each dealer renting a table at the convention gets up to four badges, some of which may be issued to persons not actually helping the dealer. This is difficult to regulate.) Should we cut back the number of badges and/or limit hours? "Early Bird" badge holders can be a nuisance to dealers not yet set up, and may also have the opportunity to buy material before other dealers. The show committee will likely begin admitting "Early Bird" badge holders at 9:00 AM on Friday next year rather than 8:00 AM, when dealer setup begins. It was suggested that "Early Bird" badges should also have the person's name. It was also suggested that all dealer badge holders should be PNNA members, however this is only practical to enforce for the primary dealer renting the table.

Past President – By tradition, the outgoing president (Larry Gaye) becomes an honorary life member (HLM) of the PNNA; he was previously a paid life member.

Treasurer Scott Loos reported a total cash balance of \$68,994. Motion [Bruce W./Mark G.] to accept treasurer's report. Passed.

Advertising – There was a discussion about issues raised this year, including who should be allowed to advertise on the back cover of *The Nor'wester*, and whether or not advertisers should be able to make general claims about being "the best," "the finest," "preferred," etc. We should make the process more formal next year for the issue of *The Nor'wester* that will be distributed at the ANA convention in Portland. The editor will make recommendations this fall. It is unlikely that the PNNA will censor claims of a general or vague nature, however a stronger advertising disclaimer may appear.

Scholarships – 2008 adult winner is Larry Gaye, and there is no YN award. Larry was the only applicant this year. Brief discussion of how to get more applicants? Perhaps consider having a local seminar as an alternative to Colorado Springs?

ANA Board – Larry reported that commentary on the new ANA Board of Governors has been favorable. ANA President Barry Stuppler will accept nominations for the ANA Presidential Award.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:25 AM.

### ANA Board Acknowledges Lamp of Knowledge as Official Seal

The American Numismatic Association Board of Governors has voted unanimously to acknowledge that the “Lamp of Knowledge” is and remains the official seal of the Association.

The vote, taken during a conference call on June 2, authorizes the use of the Lamp of Knowledge on certificates, awards, the ANA Federal Charter, Bylaws and Code of Ethics documents. The ANA will continue its use of the current ANA logo for marketing purposes until a new logo is selected by the membership and confirmed by the Board. The current logo, created around the Peace Dollar, has been in use since 2003.

ANA President Barry Stuppler, who has championed the creation of a new logo, announced plans last winter to ask five accomplished medallic artists to develop designs for a new logo. Those designs, which were submitted in April, were to be displayed on the ANA website and published in *The Numismatist*. Members would then vote on their favorite designs.

“We received some beautiful artwork,” Stuppler said. “However, the designs we received would be difficult to use in a variety of ways as required for a logo. As a result, we have decided to seek additional input from artists from a variety of disciplines.”

Stuppler said that once artists have been identified and additional submissions received, the membership would be asked to provide input.

“We want to be sure that we make the right decision in selecting a logo for this Association and that the voices of our membership are heard,” Stuppler said.

Stuppler emphasized that no operating funds will be utilized to develop or implement a new logo. “We will need to raise about \$62,000, and no new logo will be implemented until those funds are in hand.” He added that the fundraising effort has been seeded with a \$2,000 anonymous donation.

Stuppler said the decision to use the Lamp of Knowledge as the official seal recognizes the desire of many members to utilize the time-honored symbol. “It’s an important icon to so many of our members,” he said. “I think that placing the old logo on official medals, awards and documents is a vital step in responding to the wishes of the membership.”

#### A British Token Congress in Seattle!!

Thanks to the efforts of British token dealer and enthusiast Bill McKivor, there will be a British Token Congress in Seattle, May 14-16, 2009, and Bill reports that plans are progressing nicely! This event is modeled after an annual event held in the United Kingdom, and will feature a number of educational programs, including a talk by Dr. Richard Doty of the Smithsonian. There will also be a bourse available only to program participants (not open to the public).

This event is jointly backed by the PNNA and the Conder Token Collectors Club (CTCC), and the cost to participants is \$395 per person, including two nights at a hotel, Congress registration, and meals. A \$195 deposit is required by September 1.
