PNNA fall coin shows started again in 2021 (now in Tukwila, Wash.) and will be reported separately on the website.

We are very fortunate to have them and all the members and volunteers who pitch in to make this a most excellent event. Special thanks go to our host, the DoubleTree Hotel at Lloyd Center. There was a PNNA Board meeting at the Portland Mini-Con on Saturday, October 14 following the 6:00 PM bourse closing.


Larry reported after the show that the "Willamette Coin Club is very happy with the outcome of the Mini-Con held this past October."

Each was presented with an ANA Presidential Certificate of Appreciation Plaque by Governor **Walt Ostromecki** (center). The feting took place during the PNNA board meeting and dinner, Saturday, Oct. 18, 2008, at the PNNA-Willamette Mini-Con convention in Portland, Ore.

The 2008 Portland (OR) Mini-Con convention, cosponsored by the PNNA and the Willamette Coin Club, saw a small drop in overall show visitor attendance from last years' 700 plus. "The show attendance was most certainly impacted by the current economic crisis," commented General Chairman, Larry Gaye. Many dealers noted their overall sales were lower than last year's pace and nary a bullion piece was to be found on the bourse floor. The hottest numismatic sales items were paper currency, modern US Mint offerings and mid-grade (VF-XF) raw type coins. Dealer Dennis Reed, Lacey Rare Coins, WA noted, "We had to really deal, and I mean deal, to stimulate the public into buying. This was most unusual."

"Local collector outreach and education were the two primary focuses of the show," stated Gene Wiley, president of the Willamette Coin Club. "We were again fortunate indeed to have the exuberant and talented volunteer services of that passionate and family fun focused hobbyist, Walt Ostromecki, ANA Governor and longtime PNNA member. Walt has spearheaded PNNA youth activities since 2001. He is truly amazing when it comes to relating to kids of all ages. I don't know where he gets all his energy! He enlightened and educated not only the youth and families through a special Halloween theme YN Treasure Hunt and Scouting Merit Badge Program, but also conducted our free public outreach program for show attendees: ANA's Coin Collecting Basics 101 with skillful informative expertise and enthusiasm, introducing the joys of numismatics to well more than a hundred first timers."

Eight outstanding and captivating top-notch exhibits greeted show visitors. The display topics ran from

"Katt Krazy" coins to "Project Apollo MACO Medals," and from "Zimbabwe's 2006-8 inflation notes" to "Byzantine Imperial Coinage."

"Judging was very keen. Only a couple of points separated the second-place exhibit, 'Katt Krazy' from the first-place winner, 'Byzantine Imperial Coinage,'" stated exhibit chair, Larry Rowe. "The most popular display from the public standpoint was 'Project Apollo' (entered non-competitively). PNNA historian Del Cushing brought along five cases filled with PNNA convention history from the 1950s through 1970s."

The next PNNA sponsored show (60th annual) was scheduled for April 17-19, 2009, at the Tukwila Community Center in Tukwila, Wash.

The PNNA also hosts a coin exhibit and information table during the month of September at the Puyallup Fair, Puyallup, Wash. The PNNA table saw more than 8,500 visitors during the 2008 Fair!

2010 FALL COIN SHOW REPORT

See report by ANA Governor **Walt Ostromecki** in the 1st Quarter 2011 edition of *The Nor'wester*.

Walt noted, "While the youth were enthusiastically pursuing coins through a number of different fun, exciting and educational numismatic events all three days (coordinated by PNNA member and ANA Governor Walt Ostromecki), adults were snapping up better grade silver and gold U.S. type coins and bullion at a record pace according to dealer Dennis Reed, owner of Lacey Rare Coins, Wash. "I certainly couldn't tell that there was any sign of an economic recession. On the contrary both the public and

veteran hobbyists were eagerly snapping up silver coins!"

Bourse Coordinator **Scott Loos** observed, "there is no ailing economy at this coin convention. Visitors are hungry for coins and currency of all types. It's a numismatic dealer's paradise reminiscent of the hobby's golden glory days of the 1970-80's. And there is another upside for attendees as we have an outstanding educational set of components geared toward enticing first time visitors, youth, and others to become the next generation of collectors —thanks to Larry Gaye, Gene Wiley, the Reinders Family and Walt Ostromecki."

In addition to Boy and Girl Scouts clinics, there was also a "KID'S ZONE" table inside the show which provided youth, families, and non-collectors with all sorts of FREE hobby introduction information and educational materials. In addition, the Kid's Zone table sponsored a free 11-stop youth educational money-treasure hunt activity. The coin treasure included a variety of coins attached to informative-educational cards such as: Indian cents, 1943 steel cents, 2010 Lincoln and Union shield cents, old buffalo nickels, U.S. Mint blank planchet/Lincoln cent, foreign currency, latest U.S. National Parks Quarters, etc.

Youth (ages 9 and up) also had the opportunity to play "Deal or No Deal - the Numismatic version" for taking home one of 22 U.S. prizes, everything from 1, 2, 3 cents to nickels, silver dimes, quarters, and halves to

the top prize of a silver dollar. A pre-qualification test was required. The subject of this year's quiz dealt with foreign currency country identification. Parents were permitted to assist their children in this learning experience.

2011 FALL COIN SHOW REPORT

Report by ANA VP Walt Ostromecki.

The Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association (PNNA) and The Willamette Coin Club (WCC) jointly sponsored the annual coin show and convention at the DoubleTree Hotel, Portland, Ore., October 21-23, 2011.

"An array of non-collector, youth and family focused outreach programs, exhibits and educational activities highlighted this year's show," remarked **Lisa Loos**, PNNA President. "We were indeed honored to have ANA Vice President **Walt Ostromecki** in attendance to once again lead various free public and youth activities which included the ever-popular Kid's Zone Treasure Hunt and Coin Collecting 101 Basics. Walt also held a public forum on Saturday evening for ANA/PNNA members, dealers, and the public about 'What's Happening Inside Today's ANA.""

In addition, Loos went on to say: "PNNA members James Reinders and YN Katie Reinders each conducted very successful coin-collecting badge workshops for Boy and Girl Scouts, with approximately 40 scouts in attendance on Saturday afternoon. They also spearheaded the youth's

outreach drive for numismatic exhibits which did net three entrants, including one first timer."

The show was attended by well more than 600 despite the lingering economic downturn and lower prices in the stock and bullion markets. General Chairman and current WCC President **Gene Wiley** noted, "We expected a bullion show, but it broke out into a collector-based extravaganza with many dealers reporting lively sales all day Saturday."

Dennis Reed, owner of Lacey Rare Coins, Lacey, Wash., observed: "Friday was a slow start with lots of foot traffic, but little buying. Oh but, Saturday, all I can say is WOW! It was a collector-buying bonanza."

Amiee from Bellevue Rare Coins, Bellevue, Wash., remarked: "We didn't know what to expect from the public when it came to purchasing certified coins (their massive show inventory included approximately 85% of slabbed and various graded collector coins), but we are sure glad we came to this show."

The Penny Lady, **Charmy Harker**, Irvine, Calif., said: "I did well and was very busy all three days with sales. But the most enjoyment and satisfaction I received came from my participation in Walt's educational kids' treasure-hunt program. I just love engaging and talking with youngsters and families in conversations about coins."

PNNA Exhibit Coordinator and Chief Judge Eric Holcomb reported that there were nearly a dozen cases of outstanding exhibits, with two YN's participating. Best of Show as well as a first-place award was captured by YN Katie Reinders (PNNA/ANA Summer Seminar scholarship winner and 2011 Outstanding YN Summer Seminar attendee), with Happy Birthday Oregon. Second place honors were claimed by James Reinders, A Swedish 3 Daler Plate from the Nicobar Wreck. Third place went to a YN first time exhibitor, Marie Fernandez, Mint Marks of U.S. Coins. Judges were Eric Holcomb, Scott Loos, and Danny Bisgaard.

During the PNNA business meeting, President Lisa Loos gave a big kudos to Rick Shultz and Kevin Charbonneau (Rick's wing man), who both manned a

PNNA and Numismatic Hobby exhibit and display booth in September during the run of the Puyallup Fair. Membership was reported as up a bit over last year. The January 2011 PNNA-ANA jointly hosted counterfeit detection education seminar was "a soldout success with 30 participants." PNNA will again sponsor a YN to the 2012 ANA Summer Seminar. A PNNA People's Choice Exhibit Award will be established and instituted at the 2012 PNNA Spring Convention in Tukwila, Wash. The Board also voted to establish a coin club newsletter award. A committee was setup to review and update the PNNA bylaws. Nominations for 2012-2014 election of officers are being solicited. The PNNA website (pnna.org) has a new look and members can opt for an online quarterly newsletter versus a printed one at a reduced cost, yet to be set.

The PNNA and Willamette Coin Club's 8th annual convention, held September 28-30 at the Doubletree Hotel in Portland, Ore., featured a 90-dealer bourse, educational exhibits, a youth activities table and treasure hunt, a boy and girl scout merit badge clinic, plenty of numismatic fellowship — and an ANA Presidential Award presentation. Show Chairman Larry Gaye reported show attendance was brisk and steady on Saturday but fell off a bit on Sunday afternoon. "The dealers overall were pleased with sales," Larry commented. "We were again most fortunate to have ANA VP Walt Ostromecki in attendance. Walt staffed the ANA and hobby information booth as well as the Kid's Zone activities table where a ten-stop educational treasure hunt began. He is absolutely amazing when it comes to relating to and talking coins with the kids of all ages, and adult, too."

Danny credits his initial contact with numismatics at age 16 to a neighbor; the spark which ignited and grew his collecting interest to coin dealer **Ken Basford**; and his rise to serve clubs and the PNNA in leadership positions to **Scott Loos**. "I am blessed with a wife who understands my passion for coin collecting and joins in with me in that pursuit," commented Danny in his remarks following the acceptance of his ANA Presidential Award.







- The current TIYP program also provides a U.S. currency component involving the high or low offset printing of the green serial number on 1976 \$2 Bicentennial banknotes.
- Youth who participated in the TIYP activity received a free one-year ANA membership (with online version of *The Numismatist* magazine) valued at \$15.

2016 FALL COIN SHOW REPORT

Report by ANA Past President Walter Ostromecki. This is a condensed version of the article which appeared in Numismatic News, Nov. 15, 2016.

Several fun hands-on youth and family-focused educational activities and programs topped the 12th Annual Willamette Coin Club-Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association joint fall convention held Oct. 7-9 at the Double Tree Hotel in Portland, Ore.

James Reinders, current PNNA president and local Boy Scout leader, facilitated numismatic workshops where 18 Boy Scouts and four Girl Scouts and several troop leaders learned about and earned the BSA Coin Collecting Merit Badge and GSA's Fun with Money patch.

ANA's immediate past president and current board member, **Walt Ostromecki**, handled for the 12th year the Kid's Activity Zone on the 91-table bourse floor.

In addition to the always popular 10-stop treasure hunt with this year's theme "The U.S. Nickel From 1883 to Date," he introduced three new program activities at the show:

A World Currency Challenge, where youth earned world bank notes for each correct nation to currency match. (Also see photo above at right.)

Two of the ANA's newest fun and educational youth programs: "The Dollar Game," an online learning activity involving the \$1 coin that was developed by ANA Education Director, Rod Gillis; and "Treasures in Your Pocket," an error coin treasure hunt search through rolls of coins, which was developed by ANA Numismatic Educator Sam Gelbard.

All kids who participated went away with numerous coin and currency prizes, supplied by the ANA, Ostromecki and several coin show dealers.

Show Chairman **Ed Fischer** commented, "We are always excited about Walt coming on his own nickel to handle the youth activities at our yearly show. He brings such passion and enthusiasm about numismatics which he graciously shares with all who stop by the Kid's Zone." Bourse Chair **Scott Loos** said, "There was plenty of foot traffic on the bourse all three days. Almost every dealer reported better than expected sales, which is most likely due to the steady rain all weekend." Attendance topped 800.

Several coin dealers commented favorably on the show:

Olympia, Wash., coin dealer **Dennis Reed** stated, "Sales at this show were the best I have ever experienced in quite a long while. That included both high end circulation collector coins as well as slabbed certifieds."

Dealer **Glenn Schinke** from southern California noted, "This was my best show here in years for sales. It


seemed everyone who stopped by my table bought something!"




