BEFORE THE WORKSHOP ...

1. Be familiar with the current "Coin Collecting" merit badge pamphlet. At the workshop, scouts will review the requirements.
2. Collect and bring with you the sixteen coins required by requirement 4. Many scouts choose to visit banks to help get examples of less seen coins – depending on your location you may have to visit a couple to get a half dollar. *If you are missing a few – please come anyways, I often have some available to buy (at face value – bring some change with you to pay) especially half dollars.*
 - 1: a 1¢ coin dated 1959-2008
 - 2: a 1¢ coin dated 2010-2025
 - 3: a 5¢ coin dated 1959- 2003
 - 4: a 5¢ coin dated 2006-present
 - 5: a 10¢ coin dated 1965-present
 - 6: a quarter (25¢ coin) dated 1965-1998
 - 7-8: two different quarters from the 50-State Quarter/Territories Program 1999-2009
 - 9-10: two different quarters from the America the Beautiful program 2012-2021
 - 11-12: two different quarters from the American Woman Quarter program 2022-present
 - 13: a half-dollar (50¢) coin from 1965-present
 - 14: a Susan B. Anthony dollar coin 1979-99
 - 15: a Sacagawea dollar coin 1990-present
 - 16: a U.S. Presidents dollar coin 2000-present

AT THE WORKSHOP ...

Everyone will learn a lot about collecting U.S. coins. Scouts will complete other requirements during the workshop. Scouts that come prepared (per "before the workshop" above) will complete all requirements and finish their blue cards, others will leave with a partial and

can finish later. Parents and adult leaders are welcome and encouraged to attend. Check-in begins 25 minutes before the workshop; please arrive early enough to check-in at least 10 minutes early. We encourage you to allow ample time before or after the workshop to explore the coin show. The coin show is open 10am – 6pm on Saturday, plus 12noon-6pm the day before (Friday), and 10am-4pm the day after (Sunday).

SCOUTMASTERS ...

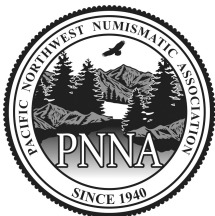

Remind your scouts to bring note pads and pens/pencils, and their coins (see "before workshop"). Remind scouts to wear their uniforms. Scoutmasters should provide a copy of this flyer to scouts planning to attend the workshop so they can be prepared.
