

Spring is just around the corner. That means it is time for the oldest and largest annual coin show in the Pacific Northwest: The 68th annual Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association Spring Convention and Coin Show! We had to move the show dates because of problems with security and May Day events in Seattle. This year's show is set for March 17-19.

Dozens of your favorite local, regional and national dealers will cover 85 tables with a wide selection of numismatic and exonumia material in all price ranges. There is sure to be something to excite everybody interest. There will be U.S. coins ranging from colonial coppers to gold double eagles and modern commemoratives. Classic Greek coins and Roman coins of the Caesars will be well represented, along with coins of all other ancient civilizations. Foreign coin enthusiasts will find dealers specializing in medieval coins, modern world coins, and everything in between. Currency collectors will find examples of colonial paper and the entire range of U.S. currency, as well as fascinating and colorful foreign bank notes. Beautiful and historic medals and interesting tokens will be on display and available for sale. People will be buying and selling all kinds of bullion throughout the show. You can also display your collection in a judged exhibit, or enjoy the displays of others.

We are working on a lineup of free numismatic theater presentations for Saturday. The annual convention brings together many of our members. This is a great opportunity for our existing members to demonstrate the vitality of our hobby to the newest members of your local club. I encourage you to bring someone as your guest to this event. I am looking for volunteers to help out at the front desk. The job is simply to monitor the people going in and out of the door and answer some very general questions. In return for your one hour of time, you will receive admission for the day to the show.

The PNNA annual meeting on Saturday is open to all, and your comments and suggestions on how the PNNA can best promote our wonderful hobby are most welcome.

- Parking is free, and admission to the bourse is only \$2.00 per day, \$5.00 for all three days. Children 12 and under are free. "Early Bird" admission (9:00 a.m. Fri/Sat/Sun) is usually \$30.00.

- There will be both a numismatic theater and club meetings. Speakers/club meetings to be announced. Pick up a program at the show, or see the PNNA website.
- The YN program and treasure hunt will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday by Tony Kalt. The program is hosted by the PNNA and by participating local coin clubs, including the Boeing Employees' Coin Club.
- Boy Scouts may earn the Coin Collecting Merit Badge on Saturday; pre-registration is required. Girl Scout "Fun with Money" patch workshop, a great troop activity, is available upon request. There is a flyer on the PNNA website, or contact James Reinders by email, coins2017@collect3.com.
- There will be souvenir elongated coins, and you can make your own with the PNNA's "penny press."

Or - ask for Kevin, or myself, at the show itself and help us while you are there! The conventions are only possible because so many members offer up their time to help. We are always grateful for all the help. Of course - if you volunteer, we'll waive the admission fee for you. A small thank you, I know ... but every little bit helps!

The Boeing Employees show in January saw Tony Kalt busy again with many Boy Scouts attending his Coin Collecting Merit Badge sessions. - Annual awards input is always welcome! Who do you know that we should recognize?
- Summer scholarships for the ANA Summer Seminar we hope you have applied if you are interested in some help attending. If not, there is always next year. (Put it on your calendar!)
- Show security we continue to work behind the scenes to keep our shows safe and secure. We added photo identification for non-public hours last year, and we have always had a security guard (or police) presence visible and invisible. We have more non-intrusive things planned to keep things very safe and secure. We welcome input.


The fall show has many of the same popular features as the spring convention – an outstanding bourse of local, regional, and national dealers, a numismatic theater, a YN program and collector exhibits.



The Wright Brothers and a National Bank President

How National Bank Notes and American History complement each other, by Thomas A. Tullis.

I recently retired, and now that I have some time on my hands I can pursue two areas of interest: studying and reading about American history, and collecting and studying National Bank notes. Recently these two areas crossed paths in my reading of history, and this encounter lead me to some interesting information about a national bank.

I grew up in Ohio, and like most from Ohio knew about the Wright Brothers and their success in inventing, building, and flying the first airplane. Dayton, Ohio, where the Wrights Brothers were from, is only about 50 miles from where I grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio. The 2002 Ohio state quarter depicts the Wright Brothers aircraft and is labeled "Birthplace of Aviation Pioneers." The 2001 North Carolina quarter also depicts the original Wright Flyer in its first flight on Dec. 17, 1903.

One day my wife brought home to me David McCullough's book *The Wright Brothers* (Simon and Shuster, 2015) which turned out to be a very interesting read. In the book McCullough tells the story of these two brothers who through hard work, self-study, and dogged stubbornness produced an invention that changed the world. This was all done in the atmosphere of public doubt and a general attitude that these two bicycle mechanics were pie-in-the-sky eccentrics who had little chance of success.

The history relates how the two brothers went to North Carolina and spent several periods of time learning how to fly. They started in 1900, tested gliders between 1900 and 1902, made the first powered flights of between 12 and 59 seconds in 1903, and by 1904 the Wrights had learned by trial and error enough to feel that sustained controlled powered flight was possible. Returning to Ohio, Orville and Wilbur realized they needed a place to

fly where they could bring to maturity their earlier limited success at flying. The best local "flying field" was a peaceful cow pasture of about 84 acres that was about eight miles northeast of town. This site was called Huffman Prairie. On page 113 of the book: "The pasture belonged to Torrence Huffman, president of Dayton's Fourth National Bank, whom the Wright's knew."

This statement got my attention, and I decided to look into this bank. Charted in 1887 as charter number 3821, the bank barely made it past the end of World War I and was liquidated on Dec. 21, 1918. The bank issued \$1.659 million in 1882 Brown Backs, and 1902 Red Seals, Date Backs, and Plain Backs. The reference I had listed only five notes in the census, but that figure almost always changes as new notes are discovered.

I decided to check Heritage Auctions website, as I find it a good tool to access information. I was able to locate a \$5 1902 Date Back that was recently sold at the FUN Currency Signature Auction in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Jan. 4-10, 2017. The note is pictured below, courtesy of Heritage Auctions (<u>HA.com</u>; also see centerfold ad in this newsletter). Mr. Huffman's signature is easily read.





The book goes on to talk about the bank president giving his permission for the Wrights to use the land, and there would be no charge. Mr. Huffman only requested that "they move the cows and horses outside the fence before flying their machine. While he liked the boys well enough, Huffman was among the many that had little faith in their project" (page 113). The banker told a

farmer who worked the adjoining land that the two brothers were "fools."

History shows the Wrights were not fools. Over the next months the two brothers learned what was needed to fly with regularity a heavier than air flying machine. On the afternoon of Oct. 5, 1905, before a dozen witnesses, Wilbur circled the Huffman pasture 29 times, and landed only when the plane ran out of gas. Among the dozen present were Torrance Huffman and his three children. Huffman was no longer a disbeliever or doubter.

Huffman Prairie is now part of the Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center, part of Wright-Paterson Air Force Base. Here visitors can learn about the experiences of the Wrights learning to fly.

Knowing more about the Wright Brothers and their contact with a national bank president has helped me appreciate more my continued interest in National Bank Notes. No doubt other bank personalities had contact with makers of American history. My future reading will be done with an eye for this connection.
