As you read this, the start of the Washington State Fair on Sept. 1 is fast approaching, and with it, the PNNA's display in the Hobby Hall. The PNNA has set up at the Fair, every year, for decades and our display is always one of the big attractions in the Hobby Hall. We expect no less this year.

For those of you who may not know what we do at the Fair, here's a brief description. The Fair is the

PNNA's biggest outreach event of the year where thousands of kids of all ages visit our display for the fun of the birthyear penny search, to crank out their own elongated Fair penny, to examine the multitude of numismatic items on display, and to ask questions. To facilitate all this, we are required to have our display staffed throughout the run of the Fair. This means we must sign up a lot of volunteers which we have been doing since March! Every year, as the start of the Fair draws near, there are often shifts remaining to be filled.

If this is something you might consider, there is still time. The Fair signup schedule is posted on the PNNA web site, so you can peruse the available shifts and choose a shift or two that appeals to you. Bob Everett Memorial Award—Awarded to Mark Gruner for dealer excellence as well as service to the PNNA and to numismatics in Idaho.

Nina Nystrom Memorial "Goodwill Ambassador" Award-Awarded to Monte Mensing, who has been very active in Oregon numismatics for many years despite being blind.

PNNA President Ed Fischer selected Char Free, David Weinstein and Joseph McCarthy as the recipients of the Presidential Award. All received 2023 U.S. Silver Eagles in holders.

The literary 1st place award winners were the South Hill Coin Club (for best club newsletter) and "The McVicker's Theatre Medal" by James Bard (for best article, as published in the 4th Quarter 2022 edition of The Nor'wester).
