Our biggest outreach event is coming up in September. I'm talking about the Washington State Fair. It may sound a little strange talking about something that is still nine months down the road, but it takes a lot of planning to do what we do at the Fair. What we do is set up a numismatic display in the Fair's Hobby Hall. Hobby Hall management requires we staff the display through the run of the Fair, so we need volunteers. ### **South Hill Coin Club Youth Auction**By Kevin Charboneau



On November 20, 2024, the South Hill Coin Club conducted its first, of what is hoped to be an annual event, the Youth Auction. The motivation was multi-faceted.

- Get the youth of the club interested in the activities of the club.
- Exposure to evaluating the value of an object, both real and emotional.
- Develop the ability to evaluate the relative importance to an auction item to the long-term goals of collecting.
- Involvement in an auction where they only had to worry about the actions of the other youth and not be intimidated by adults.
- Learn how an auction works.
- The experience of bidding.
- The experience of choosing not to bid at some point and budgeting your holdings for the items yet to come.
- The reward of placing the highest bid and winning the item.

Youth who participated ranged in age from 4 to 17. We had 14 youth participating. Parents were encouraged to participate with their kids.

Youth earned the ability to 'pay' for items by participating in the club activities throughout the year. For example, attending a meeting was worth 15 points. Doing an educational presentation was worth 50 points. In the end, more than 2,300 points were awarded to the youth of the club. On auction day, the points were converted to "Youth Collector Bucks." We designed and printed currency specifically for this event. All the items in the auction were donated by the general membership. We created and published an auction catalog. We distributed it at the meeting the month before along with a short lesson on how to prepare for an auction. There were 76 lots with every lot having a numismatic value of more than \$5 and some valued as much as \$100. It was a joint effort of many members of the club that made this happen.

- The meeting was almost totally devoted to the Youth Auction.
- The room was reconfigured so that all the kids could sit up front.
- They were encouraged to shout out their bids.
- It was clear that the kids had been watching the regular auctions. They knew how to indicate they were no longer bidding for an item.

- Our usual routine of the kids, earning points as runners, was reversed with adult members doing the running and making change.
- All auction lots started with no minimum bid.
- Sales totaled 2,147 Young Collector Bucks.

We auctioned off all the lots in two hours including a 15-minute intermission. Early on, they were making high bids (stupid money) for things they wanted. They soon learned to control the emotional bidding and start to budget for items to come. The energy was electrifying. The 4-year-old was coached by their father, but it was clear he was letting them make some decisions. It was clear that they were interested in the things they already had seen in their day-to-day life, or that had volume. A very nice 1995 Civil War commemorative worth about \$100, produced by the Mint, sold for \$25, while a bag of park quarters, with a documented face value of \$18, went for \$50. Bags of miscellaneous world coins sold for \$30. It's likely we will see more sophisticated bidding at next year's auction.

This was our first attempt at such an event. Based on the overwhelming success of this experiment, we expect to continue our Youth Actions for many years to come.

### Pacific Northwest Numismatic Association Scholarship Program for ANA Summer Seminar 2025

### **Adult/YN Scholarship Application**

The PNNA is offering two full one-session scholarships, for an Adult and a YN (Young Numismatist) collector, to attend the 2025 ANA Summer Seminar, held on the campus of The Colorado College in beautiful Colorado Springs, Col. Session 1 class dates are Sunday, June 22, to Wednesday, June 25; session 2, Sunday, June 29 to Wednesday, July 2, 2025. (Plan on arriving on Saturday since classes start Sunday morning.) Summer Seminar is an opportunity for numismatic scholarship and camaraderie offering students a wide and varied selection of week-long courses suited for anyone from the curious beginner to the most advanced numismatist. YNs, ages 13 to 17, stay in a Colorado College dormitory with a group of experienced chaperons and mentors. Along with attending classes, YNs participate in a variety of special activities and events. The PNNA may award the YN scholarship to a young collector in the 18-22 age range, as of the first day of the seminar, if there are no qualified younger applicants. Otherwise all applicants age 18 and older will be considered for the adult scholarship only.

Each scholarship includes tuition for the class of your choice, a double-occupancy dorm room and the on-campus meal plan. The PNNA also provides an additional \$250 of travel expense reimbursement for the YN scholarship recipient.

The winners will be Adult and YN collectors who are PNNA members, complete this application and are selected by the awards committee. If you are not a current PNNA member – please submit \$10.00 dues with the application (\$5.00 YN dues). Please add \$5.00 if you want paper copies of the PNNA's quarterly newsletter (The Nor'wester) mailed. Deadline for receipt of applications is Feb. 28, 2025.
